



Camas Commissioner Meeting Minutes December 15 , 2025

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. by Commissioner Kramer. Also present were Commissioner Colter, Commissioner Ralph, Prosecuting Attorney Jim Thomas, and County Clerk Deanna Lenker.

The Board reviewed the agenda. Commissioner Colter made a motion to approve the December 15, 2025 meeting agenda as posted, seconded by Commissioner Ralph, Approved.

The Board reviewed the December 8, 2025 meeting minutes. Commissioner Colter made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected, seconded by Commissioner Ralph, Approved.

The Board reviewed the December 8, 2025 brief synopsis. Commissioner Colter made a motion to approve the brief synopsis as corrected. Commissioner Ralph seconded the motion. Approved.

Commissioner Colter moved to approve the claim for Curt Wormsbaker's November 2025 Claim \$11,626.48 for Annex ceiling tiles replacement. Commissioner Ralph seconded the motion. Approved.

Occupancy Roll continued to December 22, 2025.

Chairman Kramer will get a letter from the Camas School District in support of the County Road & Bridge parking a grader on the old school site, and the County will be putting in a light pole with power.

Commissioner Ralph moved to sign the Retail alcoholic beverage license for Mama Mandies for FY 2026, Commissioner Colter seconded the motion. Approved.

Cindy Kinder and Carol Reagan with University of Idaho presented the quarterly report. Cindy Kinder advised that they had a great year with multi youth contacts. They have 12 volunteers at beginning levels for sewing, shooting - air rifles and pistols. 4 H issued \$4,000.00 in scholarships this year. 4-H barn is now a 501C for market animal sale and has raised \$350,00.00 in donations, with Seagraves foundation donating \$75,000.00 with an additional \$5,500 for a new deep freezer for the Food bank building in Fairfield. Ground breaking on the new Market animal sale building will be after the 2026 Fair, Cindy advised that they are working on updating the MOU with the City of Fairfield.

Joel Tews with Timberline solid waste, would like to have the Saturday collection site moved from the airport to 76 W Hwy 20. Joel will contact his insurance company to make sure that this location will be covered. Starting November the collection will be every other Saturday.
