



Camas Commissioner Meeting Minutes August 10th, 2026

The Board reviewed the July 27th, 2026 meeting minutes. Commissioner Colter moved to approve the minutes as corrected, seconded by Commissioner Ralph. Approved.

Commissioner Colter moved that the Board accept the applicant's voluntary withdrawal of Conditional Use Permit No. 01-26, Vacate the Planning and Zoning Commission's Finding of fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order approving the application, dismiss the pending appeal as moot, and direct the Planning and Zoning Administrator to close the Administrator file. Commissioner Ralph seconded the motion. Approved.

Forrest Ballard joined the meeting to request additional support for the Museum repairs. The Board of Commissioners has already set the FY 2027 budget. No action required.

Josh Ashmead, Road and Bridge Supervisor, joined the meeting to review the proposed bid from Peterson Brothers Construction. Commissioner Colter moved to accept the original bid from Peterson Brothers Construction on Road & Bridge, Weeds Department Shop. Commissioner Ralph seconded the motion. Approved.

Sheriff Travis Martin presented the modified agreement for the Forest Service Grant. Commissioner Colter moved to have Chairman Kramer sign the modification agreement on the Forest Service grant. Commissioner Ralph seconded. Approved.

Carol Johnson, Gooding County Juvenile Probation Office, and Tracey Martin, Gooding County Adult Probation Officer, joined the meeting to present and provide an update on the Probation program.

Commissioner Ralph moved to sign the Passthrough Funds Recipient Agreement for community-based alternative services and substance use disorder services. Commissioner Colter seconded the motion.
